

Students who do not have ample scholarly writing experience think that they only need to gather a few important materials and retrieve suitable quotes.


That's far from being real. You have to examine those materials and explain them in the report carefully.

Step 1 – Prepare a dissertation proposal

Timeframe


Build a plan that describes how you can handle all stages of dissertation writing within a particular time frame.

Include a "Recommendations for future research" section at the end of this section, where you can suggest future research that will further explain the issue. Explain that you recommend this study and what shape it can take.

Bibliography
